Ms. Gupta was an Advisor of a Unified Communications Company, AGC Networks and a Board Member of Aegis USA, a call center company. Prior to this, Ms. Gupta was the Chief Relationship Officer for Aegis Communications Group in Irving, Texas, a 60,000 people company, which boats of a successful exit. She has been in external organizations such as a key executive at the Greater Irving-Las Colinas Chamber of Commerce, Vistage Forum, the Young Entrepreneurs Organization (YEO) and the Dallas Round Table (DRT).
